TOP 3 SNORKEL TIPS

- Always attach the snorkel on the left-hand side of the mask with the snorkel keeper attached over the adjustable mask straps. This is good practice for all snorkelers and prevents interference with hoses while scuba diving.
- Build a Save-A-Snorkel kit including a replacement mouthpieces, backup snorkel keepers and zip ties.
- Freedivers prefer to use contoured (J type) snorkels for the rigid structure that provides increased hydrodynamics while descending and ascending the water column.
